The Jump START pediatric multi-casualty triage tool was developed by Dr. Romig, a pediatric emergency physician in Miami, Florida. Jump START can be utilized from birth to adolescence and incorporates unique assessment needs of children. Jump START has been widely adopted by hospital ED's and EMS personnel involved in pediatric MCI's throughout the country.

Flu Vaccination for the 2011 – 2012 Influenza Season

According to the AAP, everyone 6 months of age and older should receive influenza vaccine for the 2011 – 2012 season. A person's immunity decreases as much as 50 percent 6-12 months after vaccination. Receiving another dose annually will provide optimal protection, and prevent health complications in vulnerable populations with underlying health conditions.
